March Court before the Sheriff Time ayes should nominate two or three officers
for Sheriff out of which the Governor and Council should appoint one for Sheriff
we further humbly represent to the House that those 2 seem to be the only ag-
grievances amongst all that were then offered that now require Redress both which
we are of opinion are free Aggrievances to the Province And it is further offered
as an Aggrievance to this Committee that for want of an effectual Redress
of that which relates to the Sheriffs who are as it were the several Counties
Treasurers and on whose Credit and good Despatch depends the Credit and
Interest of all those that sit in publick Stations as well as of all the other Inha-
bitants and which therefore calls for a most speedy and effectual Redress —
There have happened very great Burthens and Inconveniences to many of the
Counties in this Province and particularly to Ann Arundel County from whom
it has been offered that the present Sheriff has farmed or made over the Office
of his Office contrary to the Form of the Statutes of England in such fass pro-
vided. That he is slack and very dilatory in Payments and refuses to accept
Notes drawn upon him by those that have publick Allowances in his Hands
unless he has a Salary or Gratuity for so doing which no other Sheriff in
Maryland has ever yet been known to receive and has generally made those
concerned with him for Tobacco so uneasy in his Payments that the Price of a
publick or County Allowance of Tobacco in his Hands has been much lessened
to the great Damage of all the Inhabitants especially of the poor Inhabitants
That the Act of Assembly limits the Continuance of Sheriffs for 3 years
and no longer yet by such clandestine secret understand Practises the same
Upon continuall Sheriff in all respects but little for many Years together and
by that means continuall his Misfruitures to the People — All which things we
find tend very much to the lessening the publick Credit and the Esteeem of Tobacco
and amount to a great Aggrievance — And we further humbly offer that
those things which have been so long Time former Aggrievances and yet remain
unredressed cannot be otherwise than such now and that therefore some Redress
ought to be sought For all which foregoing Promises we refer for the
House for their Consideration hereof — Signed & Order
