By the Council in Assembly July 3. 1714 Read and will pass with the Amendments Signed by Order W. Bladen S. Conl.

Read the third Time and past for ingrossing. The Mainorance of Mr. Dadd And then delivered Mr. Speaker the Bill for reviving Mary and Ann Soward Daughters and Co. Heirs of William Soward late of Dorchester County Deed Son and Heir of George Soward formerly in the said County in a certain Tract of Land in Dorchester called Sectar with the following Indorsement vizt.
