Mr. Speaker the following Message vizt

By his Excellency the Gov^r and Council October y^e 8th 1714

Gent.

It being offered to this Board that very indifferent Crops of Indian
Corn have been made this present Year, his Excellency desires you will give your Advice
whether it may not be fit to prohibit the Exportation of Indian Grain for some
Months until it may be the better judged whether the Province can subsist
themselves and spare any for Exportation. Signed by Order W. Bladen Esq.

Philomon Boyd Esq; and Lot's Richard Tilghman Esq; from the Honble Council enter
the House and acquaint Mr. Speaker that his Excellency the Gov^r commands this House
immediately to attend him in the Council Chamber.

The House accordingly adjourns to the Council Chamber.

Then the House met again and Mr. Speaker reported to the House that his Excellency the
Gov^r was pleased to direct that this House should wave doing any other Business
but laying the Levy this Session in regard that he had seen some Prints giving
an Account of the Queen's Death.

The following Message was prepared and sent to the Council and ordered to be entered
as follows vizt

By the House of Delegates October y^e 8th 1714

May it please your Honours, His Excellency having directed us to wave all other
Business this Session but laying the publick Levy by Reason of the doleful
News of the Death of her Sacred Majesty Queen Ann our late Sovereign, desire
your Honours to put in your Claims that the publick Accounts may be stated, it
being ordered that no Claims be received after ten of the Clock to Morrow Morning
