or more of the Members of your House to join with some of this Board on Monday
next to apponion the respective Allowances in the several Counties

By the House of Delegates October ye 8th 1778

Your Message about the prohibiting the Exportation of Indian
Corn this present Year being considered this House acknowledges the same to
be of great Importance and tending in all likelihood to the Welfare of this
Province of which your City and Honours always show your tender Regard
We humbly offer the prohibiting the Exportation from the tenth Day of November
till the tenth Day of March next by such Means as to your City and Honours
shall seem proper may be of singular Advantage. At which Time your City
maybe informed whether it may be necessary to continue the said Prohibition
