Whereupon the House in Obedience to his City's Command went to attend his City accordingly in the Council Chamber to see him assent to the said Bill on Behalf of his Majesty, wherein Mr. Speaker presented to his City the Bill of a most joyful and just Recognition of the immediate lawful and undoubted Succession and Right of the <sup>the</sup> Crown of Great Britain and of the Kingdoms and Dominions therunto belonging to the Kings Most Excellent Majesty which his Excellency the Gov. was pleased to enact into a Law by sealing the same with the Seal of this Province and indorsing it in the following words Viz<sup>n</sup>
