 himself and wife it is the Opinion of the House they are accountable for 1 Bar-
 of Powder containing 500 lb besides what is contained in the said Report —

May it please your Excellency and Honours

This House taking Notice of a
 Complaint of some of the Militia Officers of Charles County referred to the House
 of Delegates by the Honble Council on the 6th of May 1712 against Philommon
 Homslay and Mary his wife lately called Mary Cortes about embezzling some
 of the Arms and Ammunition of this Province delivered out of the publick
 Stock at Annapolis in the Year 1706 to Col. John Cortes deceased thought
 fit to call the said Philommon and Mary before the Bar of this House to answer
 the same. On Examination of whom it fully appears that the said Philommon
 and Mary his wife as she is Exec of the said Col. John Cortes are still accountable
