An ingrossed Bill declaring all Laws heretofore made which have been recanted this
present Sessions of Assembly to be repealed was on the third Day of June 1715 Read
and assented to by the House of Delegates and signed by Order the Honourable P. He did
The same is sent up to the Honble Council by Major Woolford & Capt Dallahus
They return and say they delivered the Bill.

It Colo Richard Tilghman from the Honble Council acquaints Mr Speaker that the
Honble Council had agreed and assented to the following ingrossed Bill the 3. June 1715
An ingrossed Bill declaring all Laws heretofore made which have been recanted this
present Sessions of Assembly to be repealed.

Ordered That Mr Speaker in the Name of this House write to Colo Blackiston Agent
for this Province about the Affairs of this Province wherein his Negotiation is more
particularly necessary.

Mr Bordley and three more are sent to acquaint his Excellency that there is no
thing lies before this House at present. They return & say they acquainted his Excellency
theroof.

It Colo Samuel Young from the Honble Council acquaints Mr Speaker that his
Excellency commands him and the whole House immediately to attend him in the
Council Chamber.

Whereupon Mr Speaker and the House went to attend his Excellency accordingly
where his Excellency was pleased to Enact the several Bills following into Laws
by sealing them with the Great Seal of this Province and indorsing them severally
in the manner following Viz

On the Behalf of his Sacred Majesty King George of Great Britain &c I
wile this be a Law
To Hart

Publick Laws past and amended this Sessions are as follow Viz

- An ingrossed Bill for Recognition ^{and} ~~estab~~ ^{impetration of}
- An ingrossed Bill for Broad Breeds ^{of} Horses & Mares from Pennsylvania.
- An ingrossed Bill repealing a clause in an Act for Establishment of Religious wor-
-ship and appointing the Oaths of Abjuration to be taken in this Province
- An ingrossed Bill for Limitation of certain Actions and for avoiding suits at Law.
- An ingrossed Bill for the publishing and recording the Laws ^{of} and transmitting jour-
-nals of the Council in Assembly and of the House of Delegates to the Secretarys Office.
- An ingrossed Bill against Adultery and Fornication.
- An ingrossed Bill for Stay of Execution after the tenth of May yearly.
