When the House met again according to adjournm<sup>t</sup> present as yesterday  
A Motion being made and the Question putt whether the Act for regulating & ordering the Militia of this Province for the better Defence thereof shall be revived adding the Clauses in the last Act for reviving the same made last Sessions to endure for 3 years & the end of the Next Sessions after the 3 years resolved in the affirmative by Majority of Votes

Ordered - The Com<sup>t</sup> of Law prepare and bring in this Morning a Bill for reviving an Act entituled an Act for regulating and ordering the Militia of this Province for the better Defence thereof adding the Clauses in the Act for reviving the same made Last Sessions to endure for 3 years and the end of the Next Sessions of Assembly after 3 years

A Bill Reviving and Continuing an Act of Assembly of this Province Entituled an Act for the ordering and regulating the Militia of this Province for the better Security and Defence thereof and for supplying some defects therein was Read the first and second time by Especial Order & Ordered to be Endorsed this viz<sup>t</sup>
