

Captin Thomas Downra agreeth to Compleat & finish the House he undertook on the 1st Novemb 1713 to Build to Lodge the Publick Strins in by the first Day of October the Dimensions of a^d House is as Mentioned in fol: 103 of the Journall of Car: S. sic: to be built 25 foot long and 10 foot wide and Ten foot pitch sawed frame planked withinside and without well shingled and to be built on a publick ground,

Cole Addison and Cole Felghman from the Honble Council Enters the House and Delivers M^o Speaker the Bill reviving and Continuing an Act of Assembly of this Province Entit^{ed} an Act for the ordering and regulating the Militia of this Province for the better Security and defence thereof and for supplying some defects therein with the following Endorsement viz^t

Read in Council and will pass,

By the House of Delegates July 1st 1714

The same was read in the House and passed for Engrossing
The House adjourns till one a Clock in the after Noon
Thursday after Noon -

The House met againe according to adjournm^t present as in the Morning
The Petition of Tho: Maclnemara sent Down by Cole Whittington
from the Honble Council is read and ordered to be entered as follows:

In his Excellty the Gov: & Council in Assembly

The humble Petition of Tho: Maclnemara

Humbly Sheweth

That whereas your Petitioner has with many others Joyned in a Petition to your Excellty and Honours praying leave to speak to a Bill for relieving the Inhabitants of this Province from some Aggravances in the prosecution of Suits at Law - your Petitioner being employed in the publick Service could not attend your Excellty & Honours at the time app^ointed for hearing the other Pet^{rs} - That your Pet^r hopes he has some reasons not urged by the other Pet^{rs} to offer whereby he hopes to gaine your Excellty & Hono^rs recommendation to the honble the House of Delegates to insert in the 1st Act the Clause that was in the former for allowing of Attorneys in the County Courts 200 of £ob: in all Actions where the Demand exceeds 10- or 2000 of £ob: - Therefore he prays your Excellty & Hon^r to admit him before this Honble Board to offer his 1st reasons - And he shall praye - with the following Endorsement viz^t

July the first 1714

Upon reading this Petition his Excellty and this Board Do recommend that the Clause in the Petition mentioned relating to the Attorneys be inserted in the Bill now before the Delegates, Signed & Order

W Bladen & Lewis

Whereupon the Question is putt whether the 1st Clause shall be inserted
It is Resolved in the Negative by Majority of Votes
