Bill for limitation of Officers fees with the following Endorsem^t 6th 1714

By the Council in Assembly June 4th 30th 1714

This Bill being read and Debated at this Board It is thought if it should pass
and the officers fees be reduced as is thereby proposed. It will not only discourage
men of good learning, Integrity and parts to accept of some of the inferior
offices herein mentioned but also lessen and Debale the State and Dignity of
the Superior offices which in their several stations are most usefull in this
Province either in the Administ^r of Justice or Execution thereof and
ought to be handsomely supported according to their several Characters not only
for the sake of their own merit and Capacities but for the Honour of
the Gov^{rnm^t}

it self whereof they are the immediate Ministers - Therefore
this Board Cannot agree to the Bill. But desire the former Law may be
revived with the Explanatory Cl^t thereto - This Excl^tly the Gov^r & this Board
inclining not only to Encourage & Support such Officers as Diligently &
faithfully discharge their Duty but likewise to punish and suppress those
that are any way guilty of Bribery Extortion negligence or any other
unfaithfull misdemeanours in the Execution of the several offices and
trusts reposed in them according to the utmost severity of the Law
