CITIZENS Upon Reading your Answer to our Message of the 28 June
of Col Holland and Col Young relating to some Statutes of England - We
have reason to believe you have misconceived our proposal therein by which we did
not offer to you that the General Assembly should concert what Statutes should be
in force here - But that the question should be solely stated to the Lawyers in England
to know whether the said Statutes should be in force here or not they being often Ascertained as
Law and very often Dulyed which introduces very great doubts and Confusion in the Course
of Justice here - We do agree with your House that the time of year does not well admitt
you to belong absent from your respective Habitacions therefore shall readily concur
with you in the speedy Conclusion of this Session
