1. That the Sheriff shall be allowed 5<sup>s</sup> of Tob. & Day for Imprisonment last & victuals twenty four hours & no more

2. That all the Fees to be allowed by the House to the Noble the Speaker & of Assembly shall be upon Execution -

3. That the Fees allowed by the Gov & Council to Sheriffs for serving Leplevins Writs of possession serving Ejectm<sup>ts</sup> &c be upon Execution ascertained in the Bill - The Petition of Rich<sup>d</sup> Maining ag<sup>t</sup> Eliza Travers is Referred at the prayer of Travers to the Consideration of next Sessions of Assembly to be had thereon the second Tuesday in the Sessions and Sumons is to Issue for all Evidences to be named by either parties that Sumons Issue to the petitioner to be then here with his Evidences or the Petition to be rejected
