Edm Whittington I after my humble Service to you this comes to desire you to send word
By my Coz Diamond ^{body} Cause stands about my Land for I am informed in my Coz
body appears for me that Judgment will pass ag^t me next Court how fore I beg you to mind
that point also — I desire you to send me word what money you are out about it and I
will take Care to reimburse you your money again I am with due Respect y^r humble Servant
to please
Edm Whittington
I have sent money but it is a thing am^{ong} cannot take
every body with — To Edm Whittington Esq^r

Thereupon the same is referred till next Session of Assembly and it is
Ordered that notice be given to Thomas Paramore of the said Bill and
what is thereby intended and that he be and appear at the next Session of Assembly
to be hold for this Province to show sufficient Cause if any he hath or can say
why that Bill should not pass — and its Ordered the Delegates the said notice to two or
more of the Delegates in Relation of the Land in Question called Weyluxion
under Thomas Paramore and to him directed to and shall be deemed and hold a
sufficient notice — And Mr Samuel Hopkins and Mr Tho Parvick undertakes
to give Thomas Paramore the said notice —
Mr Amos Farrot Capn James Harris and Mr Joseph Harrison are
appointed a Speciall Committee to examine the Complaint ag^t Mr Rowley
and to Embroiling the Armes and Magazines of this Province — and are to
make their Report thereon to the House by ten of the Clock to morrow morning
The House adjourns till to morrow morning Eight a Clock

The House met according to adjournment ^{Friday Morning 10th of May 1715} present as on yesterday —
Then was Read the Proceedings of this House on yesterday —
The Petition of Wm Bond Jun and Heir of Thomas Jones late of Seniors^t County
being Read this day in the House is referred to the Consideration of next Session at which
Mr Amos Cathwood having notice is to appear to show sufficient Cause
why the Bill should not pass and in case of her failure leave will be given
to bring in a bill as prayed —
