Gentlemen
By his Excellency the Gov and Council in Assembly
May the 14th 1715

In Answer to your Messages by Mr Tyler and several Others relating to
the Revenue we acquaint you that his Excellency and the Board do
Concur with your House, that the Revenue of the one Majesty of this
Province being wholly appropriated by his Most Excellent Majesty
ought not to be burthened with the payment of any Salary to his Majesty's
Receiver, but that their Salaries ought to be paid out of the Funds and
perquisites falling in this Province. And if the said Funds & Perquisites
shall not be sufficient therefore then it may be advisable to Consider of the 27
Article of his Excellency's Instructions communicated to you. We likewise Concur with
that the number of Receivers be reduced to one and acquaint you that we know
of no other Receivers of his Majesty's said Revenue but Mr Tho Rousby &
and Mr Tho Damsy who act by the Authority of the Gov and Council here being
appointed to those Offices on the Death of George Peter George Murchamp Esq
formerly appointed ^{to those Offices} ~~to those Offices~~ by the Crown. But since that his
Majesty's Surveyor general has a particular Authority over the Affairs of the
said Revenue how and if now daily Exposed his Excellency will take care on
anixall to settle this matter with him

In the mean time he has given Order to the several Clerks of the County
Court to Return him by the first of September Next an Act of all fines
