May it please your Excellency
Having considered and debated your message
by Mr. Samuel Young and Mr. Addison about the House of Ordinary
Lyones and the proposal of building a House for his Majesty's use
We are willing that such sum be by law voted on his Majesty's Service
and towards for and towards building a House for his Majesty's use
the Law to endure for three years and to the end of the next Session
of Assembly after the three years —

And as for raising a fund for two thirds in proportion to be applied for
building such a house the same can not well be done at present till it
is known what such sum yearly amount to, at which time there shall
be provision made for the two thirds either out of the Publick Stock or
by such other way as then shall be thought most expedient

The same is sent up to the Honble Council by Major Ward Mr. Robert
Taylor and Capt. Dalahid
