

Which being read together with the several papers herewith sent it is referred to the Consideration of the Committee of Aggravances before whom the petitioners is to make appear the truth of his allegations and particularly shew the sum imported into the said Petition was the same sum as was put on Board the said Ship in the Petition mentioned and the said Committee to make their Report to this House with all Government Speed

Like wise at the same time of Thomas Addison from the Upper House & also Mr. Speaker the Petition of Grace Brooke and Thomas Brock thus Endorsed 27<sup>th</sup> July. By the Upper House of Assembly July 23<sup>rd</sup> 1716

This petition is recommended to the Lower House and that upon due proof made of the allegations therein they will admit a Bill to be brought in for Mr. Grey's relief.

Which being read it is ordered that Sir James Oglethorpe be required to shew the said Bill at Law of Mr. Brock deced and of Mr. Grey the purchaser in the said Petition mentioned to appear before the Bar of this House with all Government Speed after the receipt of the said summons, the said Parties to shew cause why the said Bill should not pass and the said Mr. Grey to give such Satisfaction to this House as shall be then required

This House adjourns till 8 a Clock to morrow morning Tuesday morning the 24<sup>th</sup> of July 1716

Mr. Justice by this House remane Ambrose that the same be rejected.
