For that his sayeth in esse made such allegations which would have been flatly opposite to the matter of fact known not only to all her Majts Ministers Council as well as the several officers of the revenue and as the praeems- pcal part of the Assembly who had made him allowances for Services prequisites as they became due which may appear by the personally But acknowledges he has often declared that his reward for the services he performed in that Station was a thing precarious as not knowing how long the same might continue or soon soon be determined by the Majts speedy dispatching a Governor in Chief into this province, That after his claiming and taking the allowances of a Councillor, he is advised and Remmly concivies it was lawful for him so to doe, and that by virtue of his being a counsellor and the eldest of the said Council and not as Lieut Governor or Commander in Chief Commissioned in this Province he took upon him to provide and execute the several powers and authority inheriting the Commission and Instructions on which occasion her Majt by her Royal instructions now pleased to appoint and direct the Majority of all Admirals and Comodore whatsoever to be payd him for his better support in that Nation and that it may the more Remmly appear that the said Edward Lloyd was always understand by the Lt. Govr. or the Secretary of State and Lords of Trade and Plantations even whist he received the said services to be one of her Majts Council the Subscription Agent of her Majts Council in the Province of Massachusetts Bay in America or to all their offices etc, to the Port of Boston in America for the time being so that the Commanders in Chief of the said Province for the time being so that the said President and Commander in Chief plainly thereby appear to be different persons.

And the said Edward Lloyd further observes that all the allowances

made him as a Councillor during the time aforesaid were and are confirmed by sundry acts of Assembly made by the authority of her late Majt and powers under her great Seal of Great Britain which he hopes the general Assembly will not question. — Edw: Lloyd.
