Answer That he did not tell the Secretary of the Comt what he would do

need less to tell he would do what was necessary the granting of the Commission
and the acceptance thereof must be supposed to be in the execution attended
with all necessary and Required Qualifications and that there is no oath
required by the Statutes in the first Queen mentioned but what he is ready
and willing to take and knows it is requisite he should take an oath for
the true and punctual discharge of his Office which he is ready to do.
That the Comt of his Martyr Customer did not require him to make a
profession of his faith and that he believes it would be looked upon as
imprudent in him to do about it before that board

Q. 3. How came he to take upon him the office of Collector General
