

To the fourth Question which Mr Carroll think fit to subscribe to the third  
who are the present Surveyors Genl of this Province and who are to be their Deputy  
His answer is that his Lordship has not yet appointed any Surveyor General  
Consequently there can be no Deputy Surveyors though the goes further and often as  
an owner writes that the Lord Surveyor and the Lord Governor his Lieutenant  
have sent in twelve Persons to survey with directions to grant them protestants  
in such County where his Lordships Surveyor places were usually exercised by  
Protestants while the Government was in the Colony and that upon the death or  
Removal of such Surveyor or any other Officer or Officer in Office usually  
held by protestants none should be putt in their places but protestants. But  
that none of the said Comissions are yet given because Mr Walter Pepp-  
er Hendry Small have the Distribution of the said Comissions having made  
with some disappointment therein from the Government (as they say) for which  
reason his Lordship and the people of this Province (Mr Carroll say) suffer  
much Detriment and the said Office is in effect thereby shut up for the Surveyor  
wants out for taking up land without Survey or execute their rights  
but a charge to no purpose — So that Mr Carroll meaning may be  
understood that those Surveyors Comissions should be granted to protestants if  
in such County protestants had usually exercized them; but what if. As  
ever Employed them is not this a sufficient Salvo that will square with his  
answer to Commissionate a Surveyor to such County where those Commissioners  
were ever held by Papists and then it would be hardly known which office  
truee County he receives purely for a protestant Surveyor that has not had a  
papist in that Office unless Queen Anne County and Quee's that.

Q To the Disappointment Morye and Mr Carroll have mett with  
from the Government it is not known what is meant unless they have reason to thin  
of the oaths for Securty of the Government will be offered them which is supposed they  
take to the Disappointment and which if they have no Comission as Mr Galloway  
says (they have not) they need not be apprehensive of  
Levity as to his Lordship and the people receiving Document by such Disap-  
pointment It must necessary be at their Doms who refuse to grant Comissions to such  
who will Qualifie them selves for his Lordships service and the trust reposed in  
them and not in those whose duty it is to put the laws in Execution
