to be taken by officers etc had no such provisionall Exemption as that proposed
in the above mentioned Bill and yet was never Practised to extend to those that
are designed to be exempted by such provision so we believe the said proposal Exemption
as fully answers the designe of both houses if the said proposal Exemption
