

17<sup>th</sup> An Engrossed Bill to restrain the Use practices used by Thieves in taking goods by force and seeing them by Exorbitant Excesses.

18<sup>th</sup> An Engrossed Bill for repairing the damages already sustained in the Recovery of the Land. Settlements Emigrants and County court officers & for the security of the Records for the future.

19<sup>th</sup> An Engrossed Bill for the Better security of the peace and safety of his Highness Government and the Protestant interest within this Province.

20<sup>th</sup> An Engrossed Bill for confirming his Highness acceptance of the 18<sup>th</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> Annals made

21<sup>st</sup> An Engrossed Bill empowering a Committee to lay the publick Levy for the year 1716

After which his Excellency the Governor was pleased to declare that in the advice of the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> Council of State of this Province he thought well to provoke this Present General Assembly the 1<sup>st</sup> of October next to which time the same was accordingly provoked

After orders Mr<sup>r</sup> Speaker with the rest of the Members of the Lower house returned to their own house and then Mr<sup>r</sup> Speaker Resumed the House and Reported to the House that his Excellency the Governor with the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> Council of State in this Province had provoked this Present General Assembly to the tenth day of October next to which time the house accordingly provoked itself so with this first Session of Assembly held for this Province after the King was graciously pleased to Revoke the Right Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Prop<sup>ty</sup> to the Government of this Province this tenth day of August 1716
