Instructions from the said Assembly we recommend it to the

Whereas eight Acts without doubt proximity

or Encroachments have been Deducted out of the Right of Justice

of the said Acts it were requisite to be enacted w^{ch} the said Acts

or Articles be Declared to you that we were willing to give

to the said Acts in our own favour and Satisfaction

was that the money given by y^e said Acts

shall be used to be made payable to our selves and nothing

being at all then or therein mentioned of a Deduction for y^e

said Acts for their Electing thereof and we having

them ready Officers of our own who are already for y^e purposes

we must pay and discharge as they need to direct the

Officers only we think it just equitable if y^e said Right of Justice

be made good to us and should think it either better or

rather better or more likely for them to be their own

Officers what we think it better for their service
