MAY 18 1861 By the Speaker of the House of Representatives  
your Exy & Hon<sup>rs</sup> <sup>11</sup> 118.

Mr. Warrack as a Representative for Dorchester  
County exhibited the petition in relation to this House  
who has the petition signed by the persons subscribing and  
their forewrits on your Excy and Hon<sup>rs</sup> to make good the  
Complaint — signed by Order Wm. Taylor Esq. Co. Ho.  
And sent to the upper house by Mr. Warrack —  
A Supplementry Bill to the act Directing  
the manner of electing and summoning Delegates & was  
read the first time and the question being put whether  
it shall be read the second time — passed in the  
Affirmative by the majority of votes whereupon the same  
was read the second time and will pass — which was re-  
corded — and sent to the upper house by Col. Botwell  
Monday. 22<sup>nd</sup> June, 1861 John Ward —

They returned saying they declined it —  
The house adjourns till tomorrow morning 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> —

Tuesday  
The House met according to Adjournment —  
Yesterday's proceedings were read —  
Ordered that the Committee of Ways & Means Bill for  
issuing the act against the forgery of papers &c. &c. —  
Ordered by a plurality yeas & nays & prepared

May 21<sup>st</sup> 1861  
Your Exy and Hon<sup>rs</sup> <sup>11</sup> 118.  
It is found by experience and sundry petitions  
presented to this Assembly that some Amendments are  
necessary to amend in the Act containing the bounds  
of Dorset — which ought to be done either by  
a Supplementary Bill to that Act or by amend-  
ing it so as being a matter of great concern to the  
Province in general we desire your Honours will be  
pleased to appoint some of the Members of your  
House to join with some of our Members in a  
Conference to consider of this and to report
