

Agree upon their Advice then that the Commissioners proceed to ascertain the bounds and if either party be aggrieved hereby - appeal to three other persons to be chosen out of the remaining Commissioners of the same and the next adjacent Counties - Which three persons shall be made Choice of in manner following viz. each of the parties to choose one they two to choose the third whose Determination shall be final except in matters to England proceeded otherwise - And one of the Comrs be permitted to give the first judgment logic reasons to y<sup>e</sup> Com<sup>rs</sup> of severis for so doing -
