To the honorable the house of Delegates now sitting
In Obedience to your Hon. & Direction Requiring me
to give your Honours what Information you
Capable of in relation to the late Lord Mordaunt or his
So^r & Acceptance of the 12 Pence which was Continued
by an Act made in June 1715 untill the ^{25th} day of ^{Sept} 1715
following and was to be paid to the said Lord Mordaunt
on the same Provention his Father had before Accept
ed ^{the same}

I doe Certifie here by to your Honours all
that Accurs to me upon that Judical Viz: 5⁰
that the Lord Mordaunt dying so soon after his Father
could have no knowledge of that Sum and these
Iore could neither have Declard his Refusal or Acqu
Tance thereof that the 12 Pence by Virtue of y^e
Law has been by me certified for my Land and
such proportion thereof as became due since the
Death of the said Charles and untill the Death of
the Lord Mordaunt has as Justice believe been ac
counted for to the So^r of the said Lord Mordaunt and
Computation thereof being by me laid before the Gentles
of the said Lord Charles and the heaver Lord Mordaunt
That the So^r of the said Lord Mordaunt has
fully Impressed me to receive and take into my
hands all the personal Estate whatsoever that
was of the said Lord Mordaunt in this Province at
the time of his Death and pursuant therunto I
thought it just and reasonable to Receipt of the
