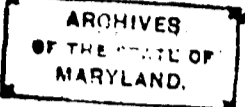


Recall the first and second times and will pass with the following amendments

Then the Question was put whether that bill shall be amended
or stand as it now is —

Resolved it stand as it now is by the Majority of Votes
The house adjourns till one o'clock in the afternoon —

The house met according to adjournment —

Mr. Speaker having Communicated to this house his Excellency's letter
intimating his having ^{made} peace with the Tuskarora Indians —

This house Desires his Excellency would be pleased to make them
a small present of ten pounds Current money —

And Ordered the following Message be prepared viz: —

By the lower house of Assembly May 26 1719 —

May it please Mr. Speaker having Communicated to this house
your Excellency's letter intimating your Concluding peace
with the Tuskarora Indians —

This House returns your Excellency their hearty thanks
for the great Care you have hitherto taken in Cultivating and Procuring
a good friendship with the bordering Indians and also for making
the present peace with the Tuskarora's and Desires your Excellency
will be pleased to make them such a present as your Excellency
shall think fit which we are of Opinion need not exceed
ten pounds Current money — Signed & Ord: —

Mic: JAMES Esq: 1719

All sent to his Excellency by Mr. Rowley and Col. Hynson
They return and say they Delivered it —

Ordered the following Message be prepared viz: —

May it please Mr. Speaker By the lower house of Assembly May 26 1719
