The house met according to Recount —
May 29th 1719 Yesterday's proceedings are read —

On reading that part of his Excellency's Speech relating to high roads the
Question was put whether the following answer thereto Should be
made or not vizt This house on Debating that part of his Excellency's
Speech relating to the publick roads finds that there are severall
Counties that at their own particular charge have made and built
and do now maintain as great Bridges and Causeways as those
that would be made over Kent Marshes and Parliament River —
at Queen Anne Towne wherefore this house thinke it most reasonable
that the particular Counties concerned Should bear the Charges of
maintaining their owne roads and Bridges and are likewise of Opinion —
that the law as it now stands if duly put in Execution needs no —
Amendment — Carried in the Affirmative by the Majority
of votes —

As to the other part of his Excellency's Speech relating
to Taxables — Received a supplement bound to the act
for appointment of Constables whereby the Constable Shall
be under a penalty of 500^d Tobacco for Neglecting to do his
duty and Every person refusing to tell his number of his
Taxables or keeping any back Shall be under a penalty of 500^d
Tobacco for each Taxable and that all Taxables persons failing
