Yesterdays proceedings are read —
On reading that part of his Excellency's Speech relating to high roads the
Question was put whether the following answer thereto shall be
made or not viz: This house on Debating that part of his Excellency's
Speech relating to the publick roads finds that there are severall
Counties that at their own particular charge have made and built
and do now maintain as great bridges and Causeways as those
that would be made over Kent Marshes and Paluxent River —
at Quere Run Town wherefore this house think it most reasonable
that the particular Counties concerned should bear the Charges of
making & maintaining their owne roads and Bridges and are likewise of Opinion —
that the Law as it now stands if duly put in Execution needs no
Amendment — Carried in the Affirmative by the Majority
of votes —

As to the other part of his Excellency's Speech relating
to Taxables — Resolved a Supplement be added to the Act
for Appointment of Constables whereby the Constable shall
be under a penalty of 500^l Tobacco for Neglecting to do his
duty and Every person refusing to tell the number of his
Taxables or keeping any back shall be under a penalty of 500^l
Tobacco for each Taxable and that all Taxable persons (sancu
