house proposes the following amendments to be made at the se^o

- 1 i ministeriall officers or other persons -
- 2 Suspending such practitioners of the Law from their practice -
perpetually or for a time or to punish such practitioners or Minis-
teriall Officers or other persons -
- 3 Not Exceeding four thousand pounds of of Tobs in the Superior
Courts nor two thousand pounds of Tobacco in the severall County
Courts within this province on each offender for any one offence -

With which if your house Concurs y^e bill will pass - -

On reading the petition of Mr Joseph Hill and hearing
the allegations as well of the said Hill as of Thomas Bordley
Esq^r and Thomas Parkin Gent^l -

The Question was put whether leave shall be given
to bring in a bill as proposed or not - -

Carryed in the Negative by the Majority of Votes Thereupon
the petition is rejected - The house adjourns till to morrow
morning eight a Clock - -

Thursday - The house meets according to adjournment -
May 28th 1719 Yesterday's proceedings are read - -

The Question was put whether the act for regulating the militia
shall be amended or not - -

Carryed in the Negative by the Majority of Votes -
Thereupon ordered that act be revived for three years and to
the End of the next Sessions of Assembly after the three
