Yesterdays proceedings are read -
Bill for confirming William Borman's Will was read and
will pass Nemine Contradicente which was so endorsed - and sent
to the upper house

The petition of Edward Smith praying
that the Assembly would grant him one hundred and twenty
feet of Ground in length to make a Sawyard of - Was read
and referred till next Sessions and Ordered the parties concerned
have notice thereof

The petition of St. Anns Vestry read and referred
till next Sessions

The petition of Richard Cole
and Mary his wife read and referred till next Sessions and
Ordered the parties concerned have notice thereof

The petition of the Vestry of W^m and Mary -
Parish in Charles County is referred till next Sessions

This house having taken into consideration &
Samuel Young Treasurer of the Western Shore his Letter
Desiring that he may have an Order to Dispose of sundry
bills of Exchange for money

ORDERED that the Treasurers
of the Eastern and Western Shore Dispose of such
bills of Exchange they now have in their hands or shall
hereafter have due to the publick To the best advantage
they can for money for the use of the Province and that
they render a particular Account of what bills they
shall negotiate to whom paid away and for how much
of cent to the Committee for saying the publick levy
on the next Session of Assembly which shall first
happen Resolving only so much as will Discharge
