M<sup>r</sup> Waites -

They return and say they Delivered them,  
M<sup>r</sup> Lloyd from the upper house Delivers M<sup>r</sup> Speaker  
the bill reviving an Act Ascertainning the Gauge and  
Tare of Tob<sup>o</sup> &c. &c. thus Endors<sup>d</sup> Viz

By the up<sup>r</sup> house of Assembly - Ap<sup>r</sup> 13<sup>th</sup> 1720

Whereas his Excellency the Governour Observes -  
to this house that he has no Instructions Concerning  
his Lordships Rents and therefore Desires a proviso may  
be made in the bill herein to be reviv<sup>d</sup> With these words

PROVIDED that in case his Lordships approbation  
of this act be not signified by the Twenty ninth day of Sept  
next that then the said two Shillings of hog head -  
to be collected after the said Twenty Ninth of Sept -  
shall be paid to the publick Treasurers of this province -
