By the Upper house of Assembly April 19th 1720 —
Gov: We are clearly of Opinion with that of your house communicated
to us by your message of the 15th Instant and are Equally Surprised
at the Effect of our Address as you are. But as the Grievances
Complained of by that Address remedied but the imposers of them
rather encouraged by having their Conduct approved by the
Hon:ble the Comm: of the Customs and by doing the Grievances
the pleasure of having the Impartial Conduct of our Gov: as
Judge in Cancery reproved. We think it is necessary to take that
matter into further Consideration that as we have hitherto had
no relief by that Address we should now Endeavour to take
proper Measures to render it Effectual to its first intended
Ends since the Occasion still continues. And as you find on
Inspection that that Address justly sets forth those Grievances
which you find to be really such we can't but apprehend there
may have been some defect in the Presentation or Solicitation of
it. We therefore now propose that his Excellency's intended Voyage
for Great Britain be laid hold on as a most favourable Oppor-
tunity for the more Effectual Solicitation of this Affair if he
shall be pleased to let therein to prevent future Impositions of
his nature and that you would join with us in Addressing him
to Assist us on this Occasion as you shall find necessary for the good
