On Due Consideration of the Act of Assembly Instituted an Act for Ascertaining the Bounds of Land within this Province we find it absolutely necessary to recommend to you to Replain or remit the said Law that whilst you are Endeavouring to Secure and quiet Men in their Possessions you do not so bind them Down to the Determination of Commissions to be appointed by Virtue of the Act to make their Sentence final without Antecedent (Except Conditionally to his Maj: in Council) as by the said Act is provided to whose Service every man ought to be at liberty to address them selves without our Intermeddling therewith By Act of Assembly whereby in a Manner you were ~~set~~ up the Courts of Justice in Maryland Corresponding with the Liberty of a free people to be deemed Consonant with the Laws of great Britain the Standard by which we are all Obliged to Govern our Counsels — Among the Several Laws made at a Session of Assembly in my last we have thought fit to Direct to the Law Instituted an Act for Relief of John Beale of Charles County Gent and Richd Beale a minor and do hereby Declare the same shall hold void of no Effect soe much as the Legislature of Great Britain never Intended to Dispose of property without Consent of all parties leaving Every mans right to be ruled by the known Laws of the Land —

And as we can never more certainly Demonstrate the real Confidence we have in the good people of Maryland than by freely communicating our Sentiments on the proceeding of you their representatives we now Signifie that altho we have not yet Presented to the late Act made for Limitation of Officers fees yet we cannot in our Judgments approve thereof well knowing that his Worth for our Country or the peoples Interest in the Dispatch of their business that publick Ministers Should be Deprived of those Allowances w^t by the Law they have Enjoyed and which ought not only to be Sufficient to pay them for their Labour but Large enough to Encourage Industry and Integrity in men of Ability to administer the Affairs of the Government whether actually residing within this Province or attending the Person of your Lord and Proprietary whosoever he is —
