

Agreeing the Bills of Law being by Special Order read the first and second  
Times with Pass - And being so Endorsed was sent to the Upper house by Mr. Tyle and  
Others - Who return and say they have deliver'd it - The Petition of  
Richard Bennett Esq. is Read and leave given to him in a Bill  
Call'd from the Upper house deliver'd Mr. Speaker the Message following  
Viz - By the Upper house of Assembly - October the 22 - 1720

Gentlemen As we have hitherto Acted in Concert with your house for the dispatch  
of Publick Affairs of the greatest Importance so we think it would  
have contributed to the Continuance of that good Understanding and amicable  
Way of proceeding that seems necessary to the Well fair of our Country had  
you thought fit to have Communicated to us the Reasons you mentioned in  
your Message by Col: Ayson with three Others of your house that you have  
lay'd down to be given his Lordship for his Assenting to the Act for Officers  
Jobs which might also have been prevailing Reasons with us to agree to the  
Reference proposed, however since you think fit to Conceal your reasons  
from us for your so doing. We shall for reasons that Occur to our selves  
have any further Intercourse with you at present on that Occasion  
Signed of Order - John Beale Esq. Mr. Speaker - A Bill for confirming  
the Land therein Mentioned to Richard Bennett Esq. by Special Order being  
Read the first and second times - Will pass - without being so Endorsed -  
Sent to the Upper house by Mr. Edmondson and Mr. Clayton - Who return and  
say they have deliver'd it - A Supplementary Bill to the Act to Limit the  
Continuance of Action being read the first and second times by Special Order  
Pass'd and being so Endorsed was sent to the Upper house by Col: Maywell and  
Mr. Caldwell - Who return and say they have deliver'd it

James Bowles Esq. from the Upper house deliver'd Mr. Speaker the Bill  
to confirm the Land therein Mentioned to Richard Bennett Esq. thus Endors'd Viz  
By the Upper house of Assembly - October the 22 1720 - Read the first  
time and will pass - Signed of Order - John Beale Esq. Mr. Speaker

Which was read again and pass'd for Engraving - Mr. Tyle moving the house to go  
home - His orator was Mr. - An Engraved Bill in Naturalization of John  
Tanger of West County Printer and his Children - An Engraved Bill for Confirmation  
of certain Orders of Sale to William Mathew Esq. of Land in Baltimore County  
And an Engraved Bill for raising a duty of three half pence of all Tobacco  
Exported out of this Province in the Upper house mention'd - Were severally read  
Endors'd thus Viz - October the 22: 1720 - Read and reported to by the Lower

house of Assembly and Signed of Order - Mr. Junifer Esq. Mr. Speaker  
and report to the Upper house by Mr. Caldwell and Mr. Waiter - who return  
and say they have deliver'd them - Thomas Dordley Esq. from the

Upper house deliver'd Mr. Speaker the Supplementary Bill to the Act for limitation  
of Actions Endors'd thus Viz - By the Upper house of Assembly - October the 22: 1720  
This Bill being read does not Answer its End for the first Act being that they shall  
Continue no longer than a time Express'd which is shorter and this Bill being that  
they shall continue no longer than a time which is longer can only enlarge the  
Implication, which can never operate against the Express Words of the former  
Law

We have therefore Proposed the Bill herewith sent you with proofs  
Add'd which we think very Necessary for the Right Understanding of the former Law  
And also an enlargement of five months time to the Chancery Court where there  
is the same necessity or rather greater than in the Courts of Law. And where there  
are suits depending that it should be some case in the Chancery Court
