

Bill to be Enacted - A Supplementary Act for the Relief of Thomas Manning was read the first and second Times by Especial Order - And will pass which being so Endorsed - Was sent to the Upper house by Mr. Mackall and Mr. Smith who return and say they have delivered it - John Hall Esq. & Col. Ward from the upper house deliver Mr. Speaker the Supplementary Bill to the act for vesting the bounds of Land thus Endorsed viz - By the Upper house of Assembly October 9. 1720

Bill Upon Reading the within Bill we find that there is not any provision made to supply the want of any Commissioners made choice of upon the first, when they shall happen to dye before the bounds of the Land in dispute are determined nor to supply the want of any Commissioners of the Court of Review who shall happen to be interested in the Lands in dispute or related to any that are interested therein Neither are the said Commissioners empowered to award Execution for the Costs or Damages by them adjudged nor to command the Attendance of the Sheriff or other Officers as in the former Law nor to return plots and Partitions of their determination to be entered upon the Records - Therefore We Recommend you the drawing of a new Bill which may supply the Several Defects before mentioned

When upon the same Bill with the Amendments was read and passed by Engrossing

Monday morning October the 24. 1720 - The house meets according to Adjournment Saturday proceedings are read - On motion of James Boyd, he has leave to go home and so does Thomas Edmondson on the like motion Ordered that Thomas Bordley and James Garnett Esq. agree with workmen and find Materials necessary for finishing the room, over the new back building and to make it fit for receiving the Publick Library, and - Ordered that the Copywites of accounts due to the Rates Governor and Visitors of the free school the sum of Eighty Six pounds thirteen

Shillings and four pence Current money for the Rent of this School house upon their Representation affd to this house - An Engrossed Supplementary Bill to the act for limiting the Continuance of Actions is read and Ordered to be this day Endorsed

October the 24. 1720 - Read and assented to by the Lower house of Assembly and signed by Order Mr. Jenifer C. Sec. Treas. - And was sent to the Upper house by Mr. Mackall and Mr. Dent - who return and say they have delivered it

When motion of Col. James Maxwell for leave to goe home by reason of News brought him of his Wifes dangerous Illness - It is granted unto him

A Bill for Relief of Richard Cole and Mary his Wife. being read the first & second Times by Especiall Order will pass and being so Endorsed - Is sent to the Upper house by Mr. Ambutt and Mr. Earle who return and say they have delivered it

Ordered that the Committee of Laws prepare a Supplementary bill to the act laying an Impostion on Negroes - An Engrossed Bill for the confirmation of the Land therein mentioned to Richard Kennitt Esq. was read and Ordered to be Endorsed thus viz: October the 24. 1720 Read and assented to by the Lower house of Assembly

and signed by Order Michael Jenifer C. Sec. Treas. - And was sent to the Upper house by Mr. Ambutt and Mr. Fisher - who return and say they have delivered it
