And the said Copies to be delivered to the Printer the latter end of the
next week - Ordered that Mr. Lee & Mr. Honygo go to the Upper house
to acquaint them that nothing of publick business remains before
this House unfinished - They return and say they have delivered three
Messages - Philomena Lloyd Esq. from the Upper house Delivers Message
a Letter of Daniel Dulany Esq. on Behalf of Matthew Wallaw & several
Inhabitants of new Minister then Enrolled - May it please your Hon

Being convened (as Council) for Matthew Wallaw and others in a Bill lying
Before this Honourable House concerning new Minister I think my self in duty
Obliged humbly to move your Hon. for a Rule to have a Copy of such Evidence
as have been or shall be taken to Support the allegation of Richard Thatcher -

the Lower house would direct their Clerk to Deliver Wallaw or his Council
application Copies of all the Evidence of any kind that lies before their house
to name Commissioners to Examine such Evidence Witnesses as shall be mentioned
to them on either side That are or shall be come unable to Travel, But that such
as are to be Summoned Down to attend next Sessions

To the Honors the Upper house of Assembly with w^{ch} this house Consents & Appoint
C^o Storman and C^o Wynson or any One to Examine such Evidence as are not
able to come to Annapolis - C^o Young from the Upper house acquaint
Mr. Speaker that his Hon^r the Governour Com^{ds} him and the whole
house to attend him immediately in the Council Chamber and with Draw

Thereupon Mr. Speaker with the whole house got to the Council Chamber
where his Hon^r the Governour was pleased to Enact the several Inquest bills
following into Law (they being appointed to by the Upper house) by Sealing them
with with the Honors the Lord Proprietary's seals at Arms and Endorsing them thus
