the Petition of Nehemiah and Anthony Loosung and Nath: Brier was read & referred till

On reading the fourth Paragraph of the report concerning the Tobacco trade the  
Question was put whether a time of Limiting the planting tob: shall be or not  
Carried in the affirmative by the Majority of votes - then the Question was put to what  
time Carried by the Majority of votes that it be to the Last of June And resolved  
further that no second be made nor any tob: Hills saved and that no Merchant or other person  
shall receive any tob: or Employ or Employ any person to receive tob: but shall be first
