Gentlemen Having all disputed about the ancient Customs and privileges of your  
house which yet we cannot agree you have any title to in the manner set forth  
in your Message of this day by Mr. Lee and Mr. Benson that Mutale Agreement  
and good Correspondency that always ought to subsist between the two houses  
gave us a great deal of reason to believe that we should have not been denyed the perusal  
of his Lordships Originate Speech for if we had required it as being a branch of  
the Legislature to whom it was in the first place addressd we should not  
in our Opinion have exceeded that Measure of Right which is justly due to the  
Preeminency both in the Order and Dignity of our house but we were not for prolonging  
the Session nor spending our Countys Money in fruitless Debates and therefore  
Contented our selves in requesting barely the perusal of the Originate Speech  
with Design Only to correct the Error that we imagine are to be found in it  
attested and Sent on by the Clerk of your house, But that we may in form you in  
this Matter which you seem at present to Misapprehend, we take that Speech to be  
the Governours proper Authority for Delivering in his Lordships name the subject  
Matter of it and which certainly neither belongs to you nor us otherwise than as we  
have the favour of our presence for the refreshing of our memories and Entering it  
Concely on our respective Journals signed of Order John Beale Clerk of house
