Gentleman. Whereas in one paragraph of the within Act it is contained that no officer or  
agent Inhabiting within this Province not having Lawfull Licence shall sell by retail -  
but at the common and usual Rates of such Liquors between Master, and Others any  
Spirituall drink or other strong Liquors to be Drunk in his house or their houses or about  
his house or their plantation on the forfeit wherein mentioned which words if sold at the  
common and usual rates of such Liquors between Master, and Others have been found to give  
Countenance to many Evill practices among handicraft Men and Labourers the great  
Damage of whom solde and families as well as the evil example of others be it therefore enacted  
that the said words if sold at the common and usual rates of such Liquors between Master, and  
Others and the whole force power and efficacy thereof be and is hereby wholly taken away. And  
how far their recompence is to your honor if you so proper to prohibit all officers having  
Licences to keep Ordinary from selling Spirits and other strong Liquors in other houses or  
at other places than they have allowance to hold them in at the time of the granting
