On Reading again the Pet<sup>t</sup> of the Clergy as of yesterday leave is given them to

Pet<sup>t</sup> Dr. Bon<sup>r</sup> a Mackall appears in the house. Ordered that Mr. Walter Smith Esq<sup>r</sup> be sent home  
to go and see him Quarrelled in the Upper house, they return and say they see him Quarrelled  
thereupon he took his place. On the Motion made that a bill be brought in to prevent  
the inconveniences that often happen by the Quarrels of proceedings in general Entries  
and Describers — Ordered that the Committee of Laws prepare one accordingly —

The Pet<sup>t</sup> of Thomas Baget of Prince Georges County Desiring to be Relieved  
of some hardships he has suffered by the late Tobacco Tax was read and  
referred for further Consideration — The Petition of Roger Murphy of Kent County  
praying an allowance for bringing to Justice one John Pidman a felon was read and  
Resolved that he be allowed One thousand pounds of Tob<sup>r</sup> in the Publick —

The Petition of the Vestry and Church Wardens of Westminster Parish praying that  
part of the parish on the South Side of Patapsco whereof Mr. Tibbs Incombant  
may be added to Westminster parish it was read and leave given to bring in a bill  
desirous unless the said Mr. Tibbs appears this Session and Makes his Objections  
thereto by Friday next — Col<sup>r</sup> John Ward and the rest of the Govt of the Committee  
appointed to visit the prison &c bring into the house the following Report viz —

At Comm<sup>r</sup> appointed by the Lower house of assembly to go and view the publick prison  
at Annapolis and make their report to the said house of assembly in what conditions  
the said prison prisoners are — The gent<sup>r</sup> Appointed are Col<sup>r</sup> John Ward, Mr. Dan<sup>r</sup> —

Hetherwood, Mr. Edward Bright M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Tolley — who make choice of Mr. Hammond  
to be their Clerk and thereupon proceeded in the affair as w<sup>r</sup> is as follows viz —

We the said Committee find the prison to be very bad and all the sides of the wood  
work decayed and the upper work very Insuf<sup>r</sup> to confine any person therein and the  
Prisoners in a deplorable condition occasioned for want of conveniences in the said  
prison all which is humbly referred to the house for their further consideration

October the 12<sup>th</sup> 1722 Signed of Order Nicholas Hammond Et<sup>r</sup> Committee  
Which being read it is resolved that a new Publick prison be built w<sup>r</sup> proper  
conveniences for prisoners at the publick charge except Prisoners Comitted for  
Debt by the County Court of Anne Arundel — And Ordered that Col<sup>r</sup> John Ward  
Mr. Justinian Ford Jr. M<sup>r</sup> Nath<sup>r</sup> Hopkins, John Beale Esq<sup>r</sup> & Mr. Dan<sup>r</sup> Hetherwood
