Indians Land for which we have agreed to the said Mag: Sewell to allow him thirty thousand pounds
of Tobacco and to pay him five hundred pounds of Tobacco more for his Charges thereon, that
said Mag: Sewell is willing and ready upon the paying or securing the payment of the
Tobacco to Execute a release for the same to the publick, with which we are now your Honors
concur and with the payment of the Tobacco
