Crops of Indian Corn have been made this present year, his Excellency  
desires you will give you a voice whether it may not be fitt to  
prohibit the exportation of Indian Grain for some months untill  
it may be the better Judgd whether the Province can subsist them  
selves and spare some for exportation.

the Governour Commands this House immediately to attend him

The House accordingly adjourned to the Council Chamber,  
Then the house mett again and Mr. Speaker reported to the  
house that his Excellency the Governour was pleased to direct  
that this House should wave doing any other business but  
laying the levy this Session in regard that he had been some  
months giving an account of the Queens death.

(May it please your Honours)

His Excellency having directed us to wave all other  
business this Session but laying the publick levy, by reason of the  
solefull news of the death of her Sacred Majesty Queen Anne  
our late Sovereign, desires your honours to put in your Claims  
that the publick accounts may be stated, it being ordered that  
no claims be received after ten of the Clock tomorrow Morning.

We doe believe it advisable if all the publick Claims can  
be adjusted by tomorrow Morning and the Journall of the Committee

for laying the Charge, and appointing three or four or more of your  
Members of your House to joyn with some of this Board in
