day of November till y<sup>e</sup> tenth day of March next by such means  
as to your Excellency and Honour shall seem proper (may be  
necessary) to continue y<sup>e</sup> said prohibition

directions for the payment of his Salary to his attorney in  
this Province, soe soon as the same becomes due
