Whereupon the House in obedience to his Excellency's Comand went to attend his Excellency accordingly in the Council Chamber to see him assent to the s^d Bill on behalf of his Majesty wherein Mr Speaker presented to his Excellency the Bill of a most joyfull and just Recognition of the immediate Lawfull and undoubted Succession and right of the Crowne of great Britain and of the Kingdoms and Dominions thereunto belonging to the Kings most excellent Majesty which his Excellency the Gov. was pleased to Enact into a Law by sealing the same with the Seal of this Province and Endorsing it in the following words Viz^t

4th May 1715. On behalf of his Sacred Majesty George King of great Britain France and Ireland do will this be a Law.
