Thereupon the same is referred till next Sessions of Assembly and
it is Ordered that notice be given to Thomas Paramore of the said
Bill and what is thereby intended and that he be and appear at
the next Sessions of Assembly to be held for this Province to shew
sufficient Cause if any he hath or can say why that Bill should
not pass - and its Ordered the delivering the said Notice to two
or more of the Tenants in Possession of the Land in question Called
Weyburner under Thomas Paramore and to him directed be
and shall be deemed and held a sufficient Notice - and Mr.
Samuel Hopkins and Mr. John Purnell undertake to give
Thomas Paramore the said Notice.

Mr. Amos Garrett Capt. James Harris and Mr. Joseph Heniger
are appointed a Special Committee to examine the Complaint
of Mr. Bentley abt. Embezzling the Armes and Magazine
of this Province - and are to make their Report to the House
by ten of the Clock to Morrow Morning

The House adjourns till to Morrow Morning Eight a Clock
Tuesday Morning 10th of May 1715.

as prayed.
