The following being proposed in answer to the Message brought down
from the Honble Council by Cott Courney on yesterday is ordered to be
entered vizt.

By the House of Delegates (May the 26th 1715.

May it please yr. Excell^{ty} & Hon^{rs}

On consideration of your Excell^{ty} and Honours
Message of yesterday by the Honble Cott Courney we find that our Message
of the 19th by Major Wards and others only signified our Intent that such
Fines should be by Law settled on his Majesty to the uses therein mentioned
and that our Consent to such a Law (necessary to give it being according
to our present Constitution and hope that proposing such an opinion consent
may not be understood as insisting on or claiming anything belonging to the
Prerogative - we therefore only pray if your Excell^{ty} approves of the
Law in the s^d Message as proposed that such your approbation be
notified to us that a bill may be prepared accordingly.
