Councile Chamber 30th May 1715.

Mr. Speaker, I am to acquaint the house of Delegates that I have
a letter from my Lord Baltimore notifying y^e death of his noble
Father the late Lord Baltimore, who as he has ever carried himself
with great Candour and affection to this Province, I must condole
with you for the Loss of soe good a friend - but as his Lordship is
succeeded by a worthy son who promises as much as you can
reasonably expect from his Circumstances, I congratulate with you
on this occasion, and avow from a personall knowledge which I have
of his Lordships good disposition - that you may be a very happy
people (if you please) under such a Landlord.

His Lordship does me the Honor to entrust me with the Managment of
his private affairs in this Province.

I therefore desire to know what Resolution you will come to in
relation to his Depts since his Lordship does not think fit to
stand to the agreement made by the late Lord Baltimore upon the
precarious footing the hogheads now stand.
