Ordered that Mr. Daniel Denton be allowed in the publick Levy 20^l
as a gratuity for his own proper use over and above the allowance
made him this session, for his extraordinary service done this session
in Engrossing the Law for probat of Wills and granting administrations.

Ordered that Major Bradford make a present in the Name of this
Province to Capt. John and two other Indians to the value of 30^l for
their services and fidelity to this Province and that he be allowed
for the same in the next Levy.

Resolved that Mr. Alexander Parrant has departed in Contempt
of this House, and therefore he ought to answer for the same at the
next session of Assembly.
