

St. John Richard Talghmire from the Honble Councille acquaints Mr. Speaker of the Honble Councille that he has agreed and consented to the following Engrosed Bill the 3^d June 1715.

An Engrosed Bill declaring all Laws heretofore made and which have been enacted this present Session of Assembly to be repealed -

Ordered that Mr. Speaker in the Name of this House write to Gov^t Blackiston Agent for that Province about the Affairs of this Province wherein his Negotiation is more particularly necessary -

Mr. Boudleyn and three more are sent to acquaint his Excellency that there is nothing lies before this House at present -

They Returne and say they acquaint his Excellency thereof.

St. John Samuel Young from the Honble Councille acquaints Mr. Speaker that his Excellency Commands him and the whole house immediately to attend him in the Council Chamber -

When up Mr. Speaker and the house went to attend his Excellency accordingly, where his Excellency was pleased to enact the several Bills following into Laws by sealing them with the great Seal of this Province and Indorsing them severally in the Manner following Viz^t

On the behalfe of his Sacred Majesty King George of Great Britain I will this be a Law,

Publick Laws past and amended that Session are as follows Viz^t

- An Engrosed Bill for Recognition &c.
- An Engrosed Bill for Importation of Bread beer & horses and mares from Pensilvania.
- An Engrosed Bill repealing a Clause in an act for Establishment of Religious Worship and appointing the Oaths of abjuration to be taken in this Province.
- An Engrosed Bill for Limitation of Certain actions for avoiding suits at Law.
- An Engrosed Bill for the publishing and recording of Laws &c. and transmitting Journals of the Councille in Assembly and of the House of Delegates to the Secretaries office.
- An Engrosed Bill against adultery and fornication.
- An Engrosed Bill for stay of Execution after the tenth of May yearly.
- An Engrosed Bill for granting attachments &c.
- An Engrosed Bill for the better administration of Justice in the severall Courts &c.
- An Engrosed Bill ascertaining what Damages shall be allowed on protested bills of Exchange.
- An Engrosed Bill for Laying an Imposition on Negroes and on severall sorts of Liquors imported alsoe on Irish servants to prevent the importing two great numbers of Irish Papists in to this Province.
- An Engrosed Bill for punishment of Blasphemy Curbing swearing & Drunkenness.
