Council all the while he acted as President in this Province and took the
advantage of the act of assembly for ascertaining Salaries to the Councillors
and Delegates of assembly which we think would have been more
generous in him to have foregone, yet since that five several acts
of assembly have been yearly made to sanction these allowances that
him and now complained of we can't but think it will be of ill
consequence to attempt to unswear the said laws, but for future hope
that care may be taken to ease the Country of the like Charge -
